


FIGURE 1a. MAXIMUM EFFECTIVE TRANSIENT THERMAL IMPEDANCE, JUNCTION-TO-CASE vs. PULSE DURATION RC MODEL






FIGURE 1b. TRANSIENT THERMAL IMPEDANCE MODEL


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
**Figure 2. Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage**




**Figure 3. Reverse Recovery Time vs. Current Rate of Change**




**Figure 4. Reverse Recovery Charge vs. Current Rate of Change**




**Figure 5. Reverse Recovery Current vs. Current Rate of Change**
