

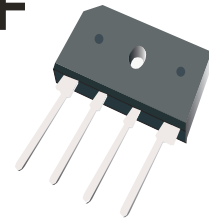

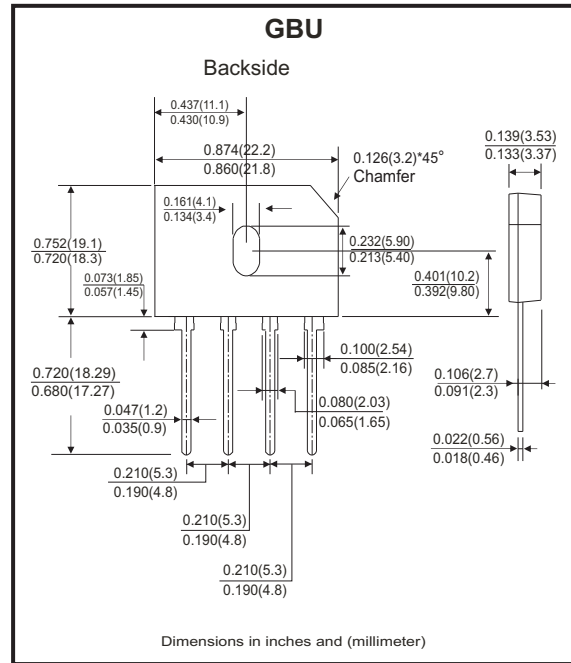

Fig.1 - Derating Curve Output Rectified Current

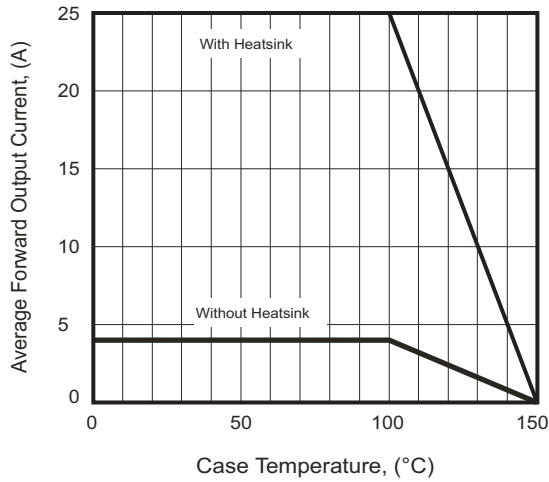


Fig.2 - Max. Forward Surge Current

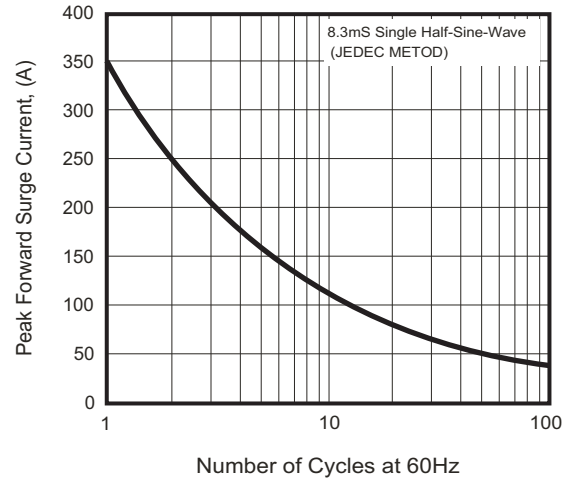


Fig.3 - Typical Forward Characteristics

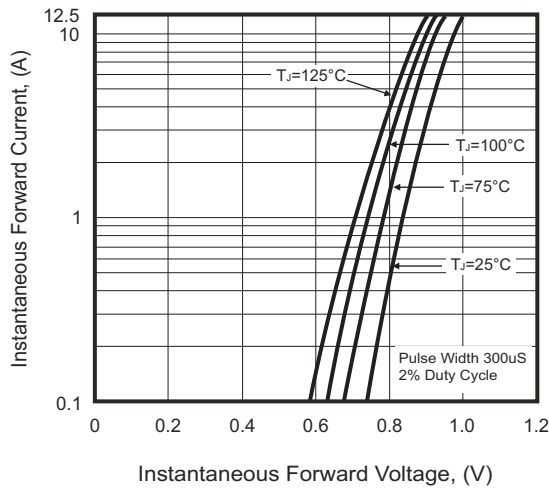


Fig.4 - Typical Reverse Characteristics
