Ultra-small 1.7MHz, 600mA, Low-Voltage Synchronous Step-Down Converter

DESCRIPTION

The MP28119 is a 1.7MHz constant frequency, current mode, ultra-small PWM step-down converter. The device integrates a main switch and a synchronous rectifier for high efficiency and eliminates the needs for an external schottky diode. It is ideal for powering portable equipment that runs from a single cell Lithium-lon (Li+) battery. The MP28119 can supply 600mA of load current from a 2.5V to 6V input voltage.

The output voltages of the MP28119EG-1.0 and MP28119EG-1.2 are fixed at 1.0V and 1.2V respectively.

The MP28119 can also run at 100% duty cycle for low dropout applications.

The MP28119 has an output discharge function that controls the discharging of the output capacitor.

The MP28119 is available in an ultra-small 2x2 QFN package.





Efficiency vs. Load Current



- 2) The maximum allowable power dissipation is a function of the maximum junction temperature. T_J(MAX) the junction-to-ambient thermal resistance θ_{JA} and the ambient temperature T_A. The maximum allowable power dissipation at any ambient temperature is calculated using: P_D(MAX)=(T_J(MAX)-T_A)/θ_{JA}. Exceeding the maximum allowable power dissipation will cause excessive die temperature, and the regulator will go into thermal shutdown. Internal thermal shutdown circuitry protects the device from permanent damage.


Pin#	Name	Description
1	SW	Power Switch Output. Inductor connection to drains of the internal PFET and NFET switches.
2, 3	NC	No Connection
4	EN	Regulator Enable Control Input. Drive EN above 1.5V to turn on the MP28119. Drive EN below 0.3V to turn it off (shutdown current < 0.1µA).
5	FB	Feedback Input (MP28119EG). Connect FB to the center point of the external resistor divider. The feedback threshold voltage is 0.6V.
		Output Voltage Sense Input (MP28119EG-1.0 and MP28119EG-1.2). An internal resistor divider is connected to this pin to set the proper output voltage.
6, 8	GND, Exposed Pad	Ground. Connect exposed pad to GND plane for optimal thermal performance.







TYPICAL PERFORMANCE CHARACTERISTICS




Efficiency vs. Load Current

OPERATION

The MP28119 is a constant frequency current **PWM** step-down converter. MP28119 is optimized for low voltage, Li-Ion battery powered applications where high efficiency and small size are critical. The MP28119 uses an external resistor divider to set the output voltage from 0.6V to 6V. The device integrates both a main switch and synchronous rectifier, which provides high efficiency and eliminates an external Schottky

diode. The MP28119 can achieve 100% duty cycle. The duty cycle D of a step-down converter is defined as:

$$D = T_{ON} \times f_{OSC} \times 100\% \approx \frac{V_{OUT}}{V_{IN}} \times 100\%$$

Where T_{ON} is the main switch on time, f_{OSC} is the oscillator frequency (1.7MHz), V_{OUT} is the output voltage and V_{IN} is the input voltage.




Figure 1—Functional Block Diagram (MP28119EG)




Figure 2—Functional Block Diagram (MP28119EG-1.0)



Current Mode PWM Control

Slope compensated current mode PWM control provides stable switching and cycle-by-cycle current limit for superior load and line response and protection of the internal main switch synchronous rectifier. The MP28119 switches at a constant frequency (1.7MHz) and regulates the output voltage. During each cycle the PWM comparator modulates the power transferred to the load by changing the inductor peak current based on the feedback error voltage. During normal operation, the main switch is turned on for a certain time to ramp the inductor current at each rising edge of the internal oscillator, and switched off when the peak inductor current is above the error voltage. When the main switch is off, the synchronous rectifier will be turned on immediately and stay on until either the next cycle starts.

Dropout Operation

The MP28119 allows the main switch to remain on for more than one switching cycle and increases the duty cycle while the input voltage is dropping close to the output voltage. When the duty cycle reaches 100%, the main switch is held on continuously to deliver current to the output up to the PFET current limit. The output voltage then is the input voltage minus the voltage drop across the main switch and the inductor.

Short Circuit Protection

The MP28119 has short circuit protection. When the output is shorted to ground, the oscillator frequency is reduced to prevent the inductor current from increasing beyond the PFET current limit. The PFET current limit is also reduced to lower the short circuit current. The frequency and current limit will return to the normal values once the short circuit condition is removed and the feedback voltage reaches 0.6V.

Maximum Load current

The MP28119 can operate down to 2.5V input voltage, however the maximum load current decreases at lower input due to large IR drop on the main switch and synchronous rectifier. The slope compensation signal reduces the peak inductor current as a function of the duty cycle to prevent sub-harmonic oscillations at duty cycles greater than 50%. Conversely the current limit increases as the duty cycle decreases.

Output Discharge Function

When the device is disabled, the part goes into output discharge mode automatically and its internal discharge MOSFET provides a resistive discharge path for the output capacitor. This function is only suitable for discharge output capacitor for the limited time. If the part is used in a pre-bias application, the external power supply providing the pre-bias should supply larger current than the discharge MOSFET sinks.

Output Voltage Setting (MP28119EG)




Figure 3—MP28119 Typical Application Circuit and PCB Layout Guide

The external resistor divider sets the output voltage (see Figure 3). The feedback resistor R1 also sets the feedback loop bandwidth with the internal compensation capacitor (see Figure 1).

Choose R1 around $300k\Omega$ for optimal transient response. R2 is then given by:

$$R2 = \frac{R1}{\frac{V_{OUT}}{0.6V} - 1}$$

For the fixed output versions (MP28119EG-1.0 and MP28119EG-1.2), R1 is shorted and R2 is open.

Input Capacitor Selection

The input capacitor reduces the surge current drawn from the input and switching noise from the device. The input capacitor impedance at the switching frequency shall be less than input source impedance to prevent high frequency switching current passing to the input. Ceramic capacitors with X5R or X7R dielectrics are highly recommended because of their low ESR and small temperature coefficients. For most applications, a 4.7µF capacitor is sufficient.

Inductor Selection

A 1 μ H to 10 μ H inductor with DC current rating at least 25% higher than the maximum load current is recommended for most applications. For best efficiency, the inductor DC resistance shall be <200m Ω . For most designs, the inductance value can be derived from the following equation:

$$L = \frac{V_{OUT} \times (V_{IN} - V_{OUT})}{V_{IN} \times \Delta I_{L} \times f_{OSC}}$$

Where ΔI_L is the inductor ripple current. Choose inductor ripple current approximately 30% of the maximum load current, 600mA.

The maximum inductor peak current is:

$$I_{L(MAX)} = I_{LOAD} + \frac{\Delta I_{L}}{2}$$

Under light load conditions below 100mA, larger inductance is recommended for improved efficiency.

Output Capacitor Selection

The output capacitor keeps output voltage ripple small and ensures regulation loop stable. The output capacitor impedance shall be low at the switching frequency. Ceramic capacitors with X5R or X7R dielectrics are recommended. The output ripple ΔV_{OUT} is approximately:

$$\Delta V_{\text{OUT}} \le \frac{V_{\text{OUT}} \times \left(V_{\text{IN}} - V_{\text{OUT}}\right)}{V_{\text{IN}} \times f_{\text{OSC}} \times L} \times \left(ESR + \frac{1}{8 \times f_{\text{OSC}} \times C3}\right)$$


PCB Layout Guide

PCB layout is very important to achieve stable operation. It is highly recommended to duplicate EVB layout for optimum performance.

If change is necessary, please follow these guidelines and take Figure 3 for reference.

- 1) Keep the path of switching current short and minimize the loop area formed by Input cap, high-side MOSFET and low-side MOSFET.
- 2) Bypass ceramic capacitors are suggested to be put close to the Vin Pin.
- 3) Place the external feedback resistors as close to the FB pin as possible.
- 4) Route SW away from sensitive analog areas such as FB.
- 5) Connect IN, SW, and especially GND respectively to a large copper area to cool the chip to improve thermal performance and long-term reliability.





MP28119 Typical Application Circuit
